


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ABOUT THE CAPE PLAYHOUSE: 1927 - 2023

In 1924 a 25-year-old painter and playwright emerged onto the Cape Cod theatre scene. His name was Raymond Moore. After staging one of his productions in Provincetown and managing a makeshift theatre, he began searching for a site to establish a professional summer playhouse. In Dennis Village, Moore found what he was looking for.

He purchased three-and-a-half acres of land along the Old Kings Highway, moved an abandoned 19th century meeting house to the site, converted it into a theatre, and on July 4, 1927, the curtain rose for the first time on *The Guardsman*, starring Basil Rathbone and Violet Kemble Cooper. On that rainy night, Moore's vision of bringing Broadway-caliber theatre to Cape Cod was realized.

A mere three years later, in 1930, Moore introduced the second phase of his vision for an arts haven at the center of Cape Cod with the Cape Cinema. Designed by architect Alfred Easton Poor and decorated with a 6,400 square foot ceiling mural by painter and illustrator Rockwell Kent - considered at the time "the most beautiful talking picture theater in America." Prior to his untimely death in 1940, Moore also included his passion for horticulture and the Playhouse grounds were a destination for garden enthusiasts.

Today, the Cape Playhouse, its associated buildings, and the Cape Cinema are owned by the Cape Cod Center for the Arts (CCCA). Established as a non-profit organization in 2005, the CCCA remains dedicated to the education and benefit of the public through the promotion and fostering of theatrical and cinematic arts - continuing in Raymond Moore's grand vision.

A NOTE FROM DIRECTOR BRENDON FOX

Baskerville is many things: a comedy, a mystery, a valentine to performance and storytelling. The heart of the story has to do with disguise and deception; but along those same lines, there's a beautiful honesty and vulnerability in the play. The setting for much of the story are the moors of Dartmoor. They have a rich literary history, including Jane Eyre and Wuthering Heights. It's simultaneously mysterious and beautiful. I've visited some of that area; it instantly reminded me of growing up in New England: hearing about The Legend of Sleepy Hollow, witches, and folktales that have sprung up for hundreds of years in this region. Lastly, what's lovely about the play is that you don't have to have any prior knowledge of the story to enjoy it. The game's afoot!

Lend Me a Tenor won two Tony Awards and was called "one of the classic comedies of the 20th century by The Washington Post. Crazy For You was on Broadway for five years and won the Tony and Olivier Awards for Best Musical. In addition, he has won the Edgar Award for Best Mystery of the Year,



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two Laurence Olivier Awards, two Helen Hayes Awards, and the Edwin Forrest Award for Contributions to the American Theater. His plays have starred, among others, Alec Baldwin, Carol Burnett, Tony Shaloub, Joan Collins and Hal Holbrook. His stage version of Murder on the Orient Express was written expressly at the request of the Agatha Christie Estate, and his latest play, Dear Jack, Dear Louise, won the 2020 Charles MacArthur Award for Best New Play of the Year and is optioned for Broadway. His book How To Teach Your Children Shakespeare, published by Penguin Random House, won the Falstaff Award for Best Shakespeare Book of the Year, and his essays are published in the Yale Review. He is a graduate of Harvard and Cambridge and is a frequent guest speaker for groups as varied as The Oxford-Cambridge Society, The Jane Austen Society of North America, The Folger Shakespeare Library, and The Baker Street Irregulars. 

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


