

ABOUT THE CAPE PLAYHOUSE: 1927 - 2023

In 1924 a 25-year-old painter and playwright emerged onto the Cape Cod theatre scene. His name was Raymond Moore. After staging one of his productions in Provincetown and managing a makeshift theatre, he began searching for a site to establish a professional summer playhouse. In Dennis Village, Moore found what he was looking for.

He purchased three-and-a-half acres of land along the Old Kings Highway, moved an abandoned 19th century meeting house to the site, converted it into a theatre, and on July 4, 1927, the curtain rose for the first time on *The Guardsman*, starring Basil Rathbone and Violet Kemble Cooper. On that rainy night, Moore's vision of bringing Broadway-caliber theatre to Cape Cod was realized.

A mere three years later, in 1930, Moore introduced the second phase of his vision for an arts haven at the center of Cape Cod with the Cape Cinema. Designed by architect Alfred Easton Poor and decorated with a 6,400 square foot ceiling mural by painter and illustrator Rockwell Kent - considered at the time "the most beautiful talking picture theater in America." Prior to his untimely death in 1940, Moore also included his passion for horticulture and the Playhouse grounds were a destination for garden enthusiasts.

Today, the Cape Playhouse, its associated buildings, and the Cape Cinema are owned by the Cape Cod Center for the Arts (CCCA). Established as a non-profit organization in 2005, the CCCA remains dedicated to the education and benefit of the public through the promotion and fostering of theatrical and cinematic arts—continuing in Raymond Moore's grand vision.


A NOTE FROM DIRECTOR JOSH WALDEN

Camelot. Why Camelot? Why must we share the story of Camelot now in 2023? Yes, the score is soaring and luxurious. Yes, the romance is provocative and dangerous. But why is it so necessary to share this tale again? The musical is based on a novel adaptation from the late 1950's. It debuted on Broadway in 1960. This material is 63 years old. I, the director/choreographer, a queer, non-binary feminist, need a solid answer to a very simply question. Why? It was only through staring at the script for hours and hours that I began to reveal my reason. It is to remind audiences of King Arthur and his unending pursuit of truth, fairness and never losing sight of our greatest asset – our humanity.

Throughout the whole musical, King Arthur is relentlessly questioning why things operate the way they do. Using the magic he was given by Merlin, he flies above his kingdom and notices no lines delineating the separation between lands. So, why is everyone fighting? He observes the severe inequalities between the rich and the poor. The rich have armor so therefore they always win. How is this fair? And he acknowledges the clear inability of the world to sustain culture and civilization by using force. Instead, he dreams of a world where people use their brains and hearts to create order.

The questions and struggles Arthur presents are questions and struggles we as the human race are dealing with currently. It's sad to reveal we haven't learned our lessons yet after all these years living with this musical and the original legend. And here is where I find my "why." By illuminating Arthur's deepest wants for his kingdom and his people, I hope to inspire audiences to look at themselves and see what changes they can implement to help everyone. Not just the ones who share similar economic benefits, religious beliefs and identities. Everyone. Let our legacy not be won by the actions of a sword, but by the actions of our hearts.

ALANJAY LERNER (bookwriter and lyricist) and **FREDRICK LOEWE** (composer) wrote some of the American theater's most memorable musicals, including My Fair Lady, Camelot, Brigadoon, Paint Your Wagon and Gigi. Among their most famous songs are "Almost Like Being in Love," "I Could Have Danced All Night" and "Thank Heaven for Little Girls." Lerner was born in New York City in 1918 and attended Choate and Harvard. Loewe was born in Berlin in 1901 to Viennese parents, made his piano debut with the Berlin Symphony Orchestra at the age of 13 and came to the United States in 1924. The two met in 1942 at the Lambs Club in New York City when Loewe approached Lerner about collaborating on a show. In 1947, they had their first Broadway hit, Brigadoon, followed in 1951 by a second success with Paint Your Wagon which included such songs as "They Call The Wind Maria," "I Talk to the Trees" and "Wand'rin' Star." In 1956, My Fair Lady, with Rex Harrison and Julie Andrews, opened on Broadway. Often called the "perfect musical," the show ran for 2,717 performances and the cast album sold more than five million copies. Their 1958 film musical, Gigi, won nine Academy awards and, in 1960, came the last great success of their partnership, Camelot, starring Richard Burton and Julie Andrews. In 1974, Lerner lured Loewe out of retirement to work on their last venture together: a film version of Antoine de St Exupéry's The Little Prince. Lerner went on to collaborate with other composers including Burton Lane, Leonard Bernstein and Andre Previn. He died in 1986 at the age of 67. Loewe died two years later at the age of 86.

DAVID LEE (Updated book) David regularly directs/writes for major regional theaters that have included the LA Opera, Pasadena Playhouse, Two River Theater, Papermill Playhouse, Williamstown Theater Festival, Encores, Reprise, and the Hollywood Bowl. A 9-time Emmy Award winning director, writer, and producer for television, he was co-creator/executive producer/writer/director of "Wings" and "Frasier", a writer/producer for "Cheers" and a director for "Everybody Loves Raymond." 19 Emmy nominations, winner of the Directors Guild Award, Golden Globe, Producers Guild Award, Ovation Award, British Comedy Award, Television Critics Association Award (three times), the Humanitas Prize (twice), and the Peabody.



JOSH WALDEN (Director/Choreographer – they/them) was the Associate Director/Associate Choreographer for the Tony Nominated Broadway Revival of Ragtime and was a choreographer for Disney+'s Encore. Director/ Choreographer credits include Smokey Joe's Cafe (Fulton Theatre), The Full Monty (Transcendence Theatre Company), Head Over Heels (Theatre SilCo), 42nd Street (Shenandoah Summer Music Theatre), A Chorus Line (Maltz Jupiter Theatre), Legally Blonde (Merry-Go-Round Playhouse), On the Town (Capital City Theatre) and Fallen Angel (New York International Fringe Festival). Other Choreographer credits include productions at the Kennedy Center, Drury Lane Theatre, The Muny, Sacramento Music Circus, Signature Theatre, Olney Theatre Center, Gateway Playhouse and Des Moines Metro Opera. 










CAPE PLAYHOUSE **EMERGENCY EVACUATION MAP**
