

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# ABOUT THE CAPE PLAYHOUSE: 1927 - 2023

In 1924 a 25-year-old painter and playwright emerged onto the Cape Cod theatre scene. His name was Raymond Moore. After staging one of his productions in Provincetown and managing a makeshift theatre, he began searching for a site to establish a professional summer playhouse. In Dennis Village, Moore found what he was looking for.

He purchased three-and-a-half acres of land along the Old Kings Highway, moved an abandoned 19th century meeting house to the site, converted it into a theatre, and on July 4, 1927, the curtain rose for the first time on *The Guardsman*, starring Basil Rathbone and Violet Kemble Cooper. On that rainy night, Moore's vision of bringing Broadway-caliber theatre to Cape Cod was realized.

A mere three years later, in 1930, Moore introduced the second phase of his vision for an arts haven at the center of Cape Cod with the Cape Cinema. Designed by architect Alfred Easton Poor and decorated with a 6,400 square foot ceiling mural by painter and illustrator Rockwell Kent - considered at the time "the most beautiful talking picture theater in America." Prior to his untimely death in 1940, Moore also indulged his passion for horticulture and the Playhouse grounds were a destination for garden enthusiasts.

Today, the Cape Playhouse, its associated buildings, and the Cape Cinema are owned by the Cape Cod Center for the Arts (CCCA). Established as a non-profit organization in 2005, the CCCA remains dedicated to the education and benefit of the public through the promotion and fostering of theatrical and cinematic arts - continuing in Raymond Moore's grand vision.

I'm thrilled to be joining the Cape Playhouse! This year marks my 10th season here - having participated as either an actor or director and now as Guest Artistic Director. I can't imagine spending a summer anywhere else. There's nothing like live theatre, especially seeing it in such a historic venue as The Cape Playhouse, or as I like to call it, "the Fenway Park of Summer Stock." It has the distinction of being the oldest professional theater in America, attracting many actors and artists coming straight from

Broadway. So again this year, you'll be seeing some of the best in the biz!

We are delighted to bring you Kate Hamill's lively and entertaining adaptation of the Jane Austen classic, Sense and Sensibility. It stars Broadway's Jenn Gambatese as Elinor and Cape favorite Manna Nichols as Marianne. It also features a terrific ensemble of actors playing a variety of different characters - and animals! This refreshing piece spins the tale of the Dashwood sisters in a modern and unique way while embracing the wonder of theatrical storytelling. It's helmed by the visionary director, Jessica Holt.

Up next is the always popular jukebox musical Jersey Boys. It's the true story of the legendary singer Frankie Castellucio - or as he's better known, Frankie Valli. His historic partnership with Tommy DeVito, Bob Gaudio and Nick Massi led to the creation of one of the world's most iconic singing groups, "The Four Seasons." This Tony Award winning musical is about four young men yearning to break free from the tough streets of New Jersey; their rise to the top; and the pitfalls they encounter along the way.

Back by popular demand, An American In Paris returns in July for three weeks with an all-star cast of Broadway veterans directed by Al Blackstone. Then we'll cross the pond to Medieval England for a brand new adaptation of the Lerner and Lowe classic, Camelot. We'll conclude the summer in Victorian England on the moors of Devonshire with Sherlock Holmes and Dr. Watson in Ken Ludwig's Baskerville: A Sherlock Holmes Mystery.

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# A NOTE FROM DIRECTOR JESSICA HOLT

It is such a thrill to introduce the audiences at The Cape Playhouse to the world of Jane Austen through Kate Hamill's wildly inventive, hilariously audacious and emotionally resonant adaptation of Sense and Sensibility. This is the third time I have had the good fortune to direct this fast, funny and full-hearted play, and every time I encounter it, I fall in love with it all over again. Kate's adaptation sparkles with wit and theatrical magic. Her inspired vision sweeps us into this beloved story and gives it a fresh update that makes these timeless characters new again.

At the heart of this story are two intelligent, young women, Elinor and Marianne – our "Sense" and "Sensibility" – whose lives have been turned upside down. We meet them in the wake of their father's death, as they are catapulted through the rabbit hole of grief, forced out of their natal home, and thrust into a very strange wonderland indeed. In this new topsy-turvy world of grief, unfair inheritance laws, and anxiety that they will ever find a suitable husband, these two sisters try to manifest their own destiny even as all of the social forces conspire to do it for them.

Those social forces are brought to life by Hamill's invention of The Gossips, a funhouse chorus of "high-society creatures," always watching, whispering and manipulating the action in some way. The Gossips invite us into this theatrical world and promise that we will have a jolly good time. While this is a riotous romp of an adaptation, the play never violates Jane Austen's understanding of the social values and strictures of the time. The presence of The Gossips illuminates how, much like today, gossip and reputation can shape people's destinies. And the heartfelt struggle of Elinor and Marianne to regain their balance in a world spun off its axis feels as immediate and relevant as ever.

It is with great delight that I invite you into the funhouse to experience Jane Austen's wondrous world anew. Enjoy!
